

The New Park.

A large tract of land, lying between Forest Dale cemetery, Malden, on the south, and Wyoming cemetery, Melrose, on the north, comprising over 100 acres, is being laid out into desirable lots for building purposes by the owner, Hon. E. S. Converse. A large area is to be set apart for a park, to be known as "The Pine Banks." The situation is beautiful, and the natural scenery charming. Topographical surveys have been made, upon which the proposed roads are all laid out in graceful curves. At a point not far east of Main street, there is a natural pond called Island Pond, surrounded by a grove. The land is all high, rising at High Rock to 187 feet above the coping of the dry dock at the navy yard, Charlestown. The lowest point is about thirty feet above sea level. The roads are all 40 feet wide, the roadway being 18 feet, and the sidewalk on each side 5 feet, with greensward between. There are to be no fences on front lines of lots. When this territory is laid out as proposed it will be the most picturesque and delightful locality in the vicinity of Boston.
